As women, we possess some characteristics that distinguish us quite significantly from men. Perhaps the most famous is our unique ability in communication. We speak more than 20 thousand words per day, while they speak about 7 thousand. It is true that there are exceptions, but as a rule, we truly enjoy talking. And how wonderful it is that we were created by a God who delights in communicating with us every day, listening to our longings, and speaking to our hearts. Believe me, hearing the voice of God through reading the Bible is the sweetest melody one can hear. He says: "Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

The Bible consists of 66 books, with 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. It contains 1,189 chapters and 31,102 verses. Its composition spanned a period of approximately 1,600 years and was written in three languages: Hebrew, Greek, and Aramaic. Currently, the Bible is the best-selling and most read book in the world, translated into more than 2,000 different languages.

The Privilege of Prayer

In a conversation with a friend who had experienced depression in the past, she shared that at the height of her emotional crisis, all she longed for was the comfort and attentive ears of her mother.

Indeed, it is very comforting to find a friendly embrace with attentive ears and wise words to guide, support, and love us unconditionally. Unfortunately, in modern times, this loving attitude has become rare, and we often end up suffering.

The sweet truth is that God is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, waiting for us to hear our prayers and engage in conversation. We can openly talk to Him through prayer, sharing everything that is in our hearts. He is the great friend who is available to listen to us, meet our needs, understand our feelings, and wipe away all our tears.

The Lord affirms in Psalm 50:15 that if we seek Him in times of distress, He will be with us. With this certainty, we can have hope and strength to face any situation.

Prayer is a connection established between divinity and humanity, which can occur at all times and in any place. God desires to hear and respond to every prayer lifted to heaven.

It's reassuring to know that we have an open and unblocked communication system to speak with our Heavenly Father. For those of us who appreciate being remembered and valued, we rely on the faithful presence of a God who is a companion in both good and bad times in life. In Isaiah 49:15, He declares that He never forgets us. When we pray, it's interesting to include the following elements:

- **Moment of Worship:** Glorifying God's name for His love and greatness.
- **Moment of Gratitude:** Thanking God for everything He is and does for us.
- **Moment of Intercession:** Supplicating blessings in the lives of other people.
- Moment of Confession: Declaring our sins without reservation.
- Moment of Petition: Supplicating for personal needs.

The Trinity

Water is essential for human life and, in fact, more crucial than solid food, as our body is composed of an average of 70% water. Water can be found in liquid, solid (ice), or gaseous (vapor) form. Regardless of how it appears, it will always be water. Moreover, each form imparts a different function to water. We steam vegetables, bathe using the liquid form, and preserve food with the solid form.

This is a faint illustration to help us understand how God is. We will never fully comprehend our Creator, but we can glimpse some things about Him.

We have a God who is all-powerful, possesses all knowledge and wisdom, understands all our thoughts, feelings, and needs, and is always present, never leaving us alone. This is incredible and reassuring. He is as essential to our lives as water. If we face the heat of difficulties, the constant presence of this God sustains us. If we confront the cold of disappointments, His warm presence warms us. If we feel apathetic, tired of routine, just a sip of this Water renews our hope.

I believe in the Trinity and accept to love the Triune God, allowing Him to be the Lord of my life.

Starting this week:

The origin of evil

Have you ever mistakenly replaced an ingredient in a recipe and ended up ruining the entire dish? When in a hurry or cooking in someone else's kitchen, there's a risk of making mistakes that compromise the food.

When God created life and the universe, He planned everything to be perfect, good, and happy. Unfortunately, someone added the wrong ingredient intentionally to damage what God intended, and today we live with evil and its consequences.

Human wickedness has increased and seems to be limitless. It's sad to witness daily abuses, violence, and crime. We live in a state of almost constant insecurity. When we look at all the existing evil, we ask ourselves: how did all this originate? To find this answer, we need to know a little about angels, who are created beings by God.

As a result, and for deceiving thousands of angels, he was expelled from Heaven and cast down to Earth along with a third of the angels.

Despite doing wrong things that also displease God, whenever we ask for forgiveness and seek Him, He will forgive us and welcome us with open arms.

Why didn't God destroy Satan immediately?

- Stand for good through words, actions, and the practice of forgiveness.
- Ask forgiveness from God whenever you hurt His heart.
- If there is someone you need to forgive, include that person in your prayer and ask God to help you forgive.

A Not So Sweet Moment

Separated by death

One of the most challenging situations in a person's life is when they have to face death. There is no pain comparable to losing someone you love. We are never prepared to face this kind of loss because we were originally created to enjoy eternal life. In God's ideal plan, the reality of death did not exist, and that is why we suffer so much when confronted with this enemy that, according to the biblical promise, will ultimately be overcome. There are several uncertainties regarding this topic, so to better understand what death is, we need to recall how life originated.

 How was the creation of the human being? Genesis 1:27; 2:7

Dust of the earth + divine breath = living soul (person/human being)

When the Bible speaks of the soul, it is referring to a person or the life of that person. The word "spirit" comes from Hebrew and means breath.

When someone dies, they lose the prerogative of being a person, they have no sense of time or anything happening around them. If the dead could see their loved ones going through needs, difficulties, and sadness, Heaven would not be heaven for them. They would not find joy in enjoying this place.

If the dead went directly to heaven or hell, there would be no need for the day of resurrection to receive reward. The resurrection of Jesus is the assurance that the dead will be raised. Read 1 Corinthians 15:19. Therefore, those who have died will be resurrected first, and then enter heaven.

Additional information:

- There is only an opportunity for salvation for human beings while they are alive. When they die, they are unaware of anything (Ecclesiastes 9:5).
- There is no biblical text that states that the soul or spirit is an intelligent entity with conscious existence indepen-

dent or apart from the body.

- The Lord recommends in Deuteronomy 18:10-11 not to consult the dead, as fallen angels are capable of impersonating someone (2 Corinthians 11:13).
- The lake of fire, purgatory, or anything of that kind is not hell as a place of torment but something that will happen when Satan and the wicked are destroyed forever (Revelation 20:9; Proverbs 2:22; Psalms 37:10).

Sweet Truth for Us Women!

Very soon, we will no longer suffer the pain of separation. Death will be overcome. Jesus gives us the assurance that we will be able to reunite with our loved ones who died faithful. Rainy days may bring melancholy to the heart, but the rising sun renews joy within us. Feel comforted when looking at the sun. Just as it rises with each new dawn, those who have slept in the Lord will also rise when our Savior, the Sun of righteousness, comes to take us.

Faith and Action Commitment:

I believe that those who die will remain in the grave until the return of Jesus, and it is my desire to prepare for that day, to be transformed and receive eternal life.

Starting this week:

- Firmly believe in the resurrection of the saved in Jesus and keep your heart at peace, knowing that God is your comfort.
- Share the message that we will reunite with those who now sleep in the Lord with anyone who is sad about the loss of a loved one.

Have you ever felt unjustly treated, been judged, or participated in a trial? These situations are extremely uncomfortable for us women. However, when we are in the right, when we are innocent, we don't need to fear, as judgment is a moment of liberation and justice.

There are unquestionable statements in the Bible about the establishment of a judgment to which every human being will be subjected. Each will be judged based on the light they had access to, the choices they made, especially regarding the salvation offered through Jesus, as well as their faithfulness to God.

How the judgment of each person will be done

- 1. The book of life is opened to see if the name is written and if they accepted Jesus.
- 2. The book of sins is opened to see if there was confession and abandonment of sins. Those who confessed and overcame will have their offenses erased (Revelation 3:5; 21:27). Those who did not confess and abandon will have their names removed from the book of life.
- 6. What is Jesus' role in judgment? John 5:22; 1John 2:1
- 7. Analyze the phases of judgment:
- a. Investigation phase: Occurs before Christ returns, initiated on October 22, 1844, at the end of the 2,300 days of Daniel's prophecy. The aim is to justify God's character before heavenly beings and determine who will be saved or not at the time of Jesus' return. Daniel 8:14; 9:24-27; Revelation 14:6,7
- b. Confirmation phase: Occurs after Jesus' return when the saved are in Heaven. The goal is to justify God's character before the redeemed who will have access to the records of the books and confirm the Lord's justice. This will happen over a period of 1000 years. Revelation 20:4; 1 Corinthians 6:2
- c. **Execution phase**: Will occur after the 1000 years. The goal is to show how God is just before all beings, both good and evil. The resurrected wicked will be summoned by Satan to wage war. As they are condemned, fire will come down from heaven and consume them. Revelation 20:7,11,15; Matthew 25:34,41

8. What hope can we have regarding judgment? 1John. 2:1; Romans 8:1;

Let's reflect: What does this mean to you?

Having a reliable advocate who assures us of liberation and justice is reassuring. When He returns, He will bring the reward for all who accepted Him as their Savior, so there is nothing to fear. Judgment is part of a plan of love and salvation.

As we do not know when the opportunity for salvation will end, the Bible tells us: "Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

Faith and Action Commitment:

I accept and trust Jesus as my Redeemer, and I will not fear the process of judgment because I have Him as my advocate and liberator.

When we read Leviticus 4:27-30, we observe that, in the Old Testament period, God instituted a way for the people to understand the forgiveness of their sins. Forgiveness for sins is granted to man by the grace of Christ, and the symbols used in the sanctuary were meant to remind of Jesus' death, the Son of God who would shed His blood as the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29).

This sanctuary that exists in Heaven was the model shown to Moses, according to which the people of God built the sanctuary here on earth.

7. Who is our high priest today, and what does He do for each of us? Hebrews9:24-25; 7:25-27

Jesus is our Mediator, our Intercessor. Just as the priest mediated for the people of Israel, Christ does for us today. His blood shed at Calvary is the guarantee for us to be accepted. Just as the Day of Atonement approached for the purification of the earthly sanctuary, similarly, starting in 1844, Christ initiated the last phase of His ministry in Heaven, beginning the work of investigative judgment.

Sweet Truth for Us Women!

When the repentant sinner went to the sanctuary and offered a sacrifice for their sins, they were transferred to the lamb and to the sanctuary itself. From that moment on, confessed sins became a matter to be "resolved" by Jesus. Just as the thicket in the new house became my thicket and my responsibility, confessed sins were taken on by Christ, who forgives us and allows us to live a new life.

There is no reason to feel alone and burdened with guilt. He accompanies us and fights our battles.

Faith and Action Commitment:

I accept Jesus's intercessory work in the heavenly sanctuary and want to surrender my life to Him.

Starting this week:

- Thank Jesus for being your Intercessor.
- Intercede for your group of three friends and for someone else who may need it, then send a little note saying you're praying for them.

The Word That Is Sweet on the Tongue Secrets in Prophecies

Women love to talk, meet friends, and communicate. God also loves to communicate with us, and this desire is so intense that, besides the Bible, He has established other forms of communication.

1. How did God communicate with created beings before sin? Genesis 3:8

After sin, humans came to know both good and evil and could no longer see God face to face. Hence the need for another form of communication. Genesis 3:22; Exodus 33:20

2. What system did God use afterward to reveal His will, His secrets to the people, and entrust His Word? Amos, 3:7; Numbers 12:6

The word "prophet" in the Bible means "messenger" or "spokesperson." God chose people to be His messengers (Exodus 7:1, 2), and they were to faithfully transmit His message.

Paul cited the gift of prophecy as present in the church awaiting the second coming of Christ. Like other gifts, this gift is related to the edification of the church and the preaching of the gospel.

She always exalted the incarnate Christ, her prophetic predictions were fulfilled as announced, and all her teachings harmonize with the Bible. She consistently emphasized that her writings were a lesser light leading to the greater Light.

God desires to communicate with us so much that, in addition to giving us the Bible, He has also provided the gift of prophecy to provide more information about our beloved Savior, how we can grow in physical, emotional, family, and relational aspects to lead a truly happier, more productive life and a character more like Jesus.

The Lord's Day

Can you remember a day in your life that was awaited with much anticipation?

Perhaps it was your wedding day, the birth of your child, maybe the arrival of your beloved, or it could have been your graduation day. What feelings did you have about that day? How did you act as the date approached?

God also has an expectation regarding us. He established a day each week to be completely in tune with us.

In Matthew 12:8, Jesus says He is the Lord of the Sabbath, so the Sabbath is the Lord's day. The Sabbath is Christian, not Jewish. In Isaiah 58:13, the Sabbath is called "my holy day."

The book of Luke was written 28 years after the resurrection, and the biblical record says that the disciples rested according to the commandment.

The Bible mentions "evening and morning" on each day of creation. Evening means the dark part (night), and morning the light part (day). It's worth noting that Jesus himself cited that the daylight part of the day has 12 hours, leaving 12 hours for the night (John 11:9). The book of Nehemiah (Nehemiah 13:19) confirms the observance of the Sabbath from sunset.

Where to Find the Sweet Truth

The Church of God

Imagine yourself walking along a straight road for about 3 km. At the end of the journey, you come to a crossroads. That path that was once easy to follow has now become a big question mark: "Which direction should I take?" "Which path will truly lead me to the destination I'm seeking?" "What is the true path?"

Jesus clearly stated in Matthew 7:21 that "not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of My Father who is in heaven."

Therefore, we need to know what His will is so that, based on these guidelines, we can identify the true path to follow the principles ordained by Jesus that lead us to Heaven.

- 1. According to the Bible, does God acknowledge that there is a plurality of truths? Ephesians 4:5

God warns us in His Word that although many may call upon the name of God, there is only one faith. He also teaches us that we need to observe the fruits to identify if they are in harmony with divine precepts. We will know if we are in the correct church by verifying if the doctrines of this church are those instituted in the Bible as the true doctrines.

God revealed in His Word 8 characteristics or foundations that indicate a true church.

1st Foundation: 2Timothy 3:16; Ephesians 2:19-20

The true church accepts the entire Bible (Old and New Testaments).

2nd Foundation: Acts 4:12; 16:30,31

The true church believes that salvation occurs only through faith in Jesus.

3rd Foundation: Revelation 1:7; John 14:1-3

The true church teaches that Jesus will return to this world to gather His children.

4th Foundation: John 14:15; 1John 2:4; Revelation 14:12

The true church observes the Ten Commandments, the Moral Law of God.

5th Foundation: Revelation 12:17; 19:10

The true church, in addition to keeping the "Commandments of God," possesses the "Testimony of Jesus," clearly identified as the "Spirit of Prophecy."

6th Foundation: Luke 23:56; Ezekiel 20:12,20.

The true church observes the seventh-day Sabbath, as it is God's seal upon His people.

7th Foundation: Romans 12:1; 1 Corinthians 10:31; 6:19-2

The true church practices health principles prescribed in the Bible.

8th Foundation: Matthew 24:14; Revelation 14:6

The true church is a worldwide movement that proclaims to every creature the return of Jesus. People who are part of the Church of God are called "saints." Holy does not mean someone perfect, without sin, but someone who has been set apart by God and belongs to Him.

It is wonderful to know that in His Word, God left clear instructions where we can find the right path that brings us closer to Him and to the benefits and promises.

What to do, what not to do

One of our major concerns is regarding our health and that of our family. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), health is a state of complete physical, mental, and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease. Therefore, for our joy, God has given us instructions for this.

Hygiene habits are also considered important by God. (Deuteronomy 23:9-14) To help us, He revealed through the Spirit of Prophecy health principles and the 8 natural remedies: water, fresh air, balanced diet, exercise, sunlight, temperance, rest, and trust in God, which, if practiced, will give us quality of life, energy, and prevention of many diseases.

Sweet and Appealing to the Eyes of God

The Beauty that Delights

Who doesn't like to feel attractive? Beauty is something sought after by many who are willing to spend fortunes. Did you know that God also appreciates beauty, good taste? If you take a brief look at Genesis 1, you'll see that at the end of each created work there is the following declaration: "And God saw that it was good."

If when creating plants, stars, and animals, God considered them beautiful and very good, imagine how much effort He put into creating humans, the masterpiece of His creation?

We should reflect the light of Jesus. Thus, our tastes should be in harmony with the beauty principles He established in His Word.

In Ezekiel 23:38 to 43, God represents His people in apostasy with a woman adorned with ornaments, bracelets, and tiaras. The text is a symbolic account, but it makes it clear that the use of paints and jewels is a pagan practice and their use is linked to apostasy, idolatry, and adultery. Jewels can be classified as ornamental or functional. Functional ones serve a relevant purpose in culture and meet real needs, such as wedding rings and watches. Ornamental jewels serve only as adornments to embellish the body and feed the vanity imposed by fashion or culture. Often the use of certain clothes, as well as jewels and accessories, is a form of display and ostentation, drawing attention to oneself instead of reflecting the light of God.

God often calls the people to repentance, to a change of life, to consecration by asking them to leave vanity objects aside.

Woman is beautiful because she was made in the image and likeness of God. Even though sin has tarnished this image, we are still a masterpiece of creation. As a Christian woman, we will be beautiful because: (1) we will take care of our body by eating well and having healthy habits; (2) we will live in complete happiness with God because a joyful heart beautifies our face (Proverbs 15:13); and (3) we will possess character and behaviors that will truly make us admirable. God wants us to be different, showing the world the radiance of someone who is beautiful in the eyes of God.

Faith and Action Commitment:

I desire to be a woman beautiful in the eyes of God, understanding that outward appearance reflects what I have inside, so I will take care of what I intend to wear because they are a sign of what I have in my heart. May Jesus be the center of my life and not personal will.

Money that Belongs to God

In recent years, women have advanced in many areas, including entrepreneurship. But entrepreneurship is not something simple; it is one of the great challenges that requires financial management. Now, imagine what it would be like to have an efficient partner who helps with these issues? Did you know that God wants to be this special partner in our lives? In addition to guiding and inspiring, He wants to bless and make His children financially prosperous. How can we enter into this partnership with God? What criteria exist for this partnership?

Let's see what the Bible teaches us about this subject.

By returning the 10% that belongs to Him, He still allows us to manage 90% of everything He lends us.

Additional Study:

The Seventh-day Adventist Church manages tithes and offerings with utmost seriousness and in a well-organized manner, aiming to meet the various needs of its missionary fronts. The majority of the offerings collected in the local church go towards its projects and maintenance. Part of the offerings and all the tithes are sent to the regional administration of the church (Conference/Mission), which manages this fund to meet local needs for preaching the gospel, maintaining the ministry, supporting church structures, and sharing part of these funds with broader geographical regions of the work (Union, Division), reaching even the most distant places on the planet.

Remember that being equipped with gifts does not mean they are developed, but that you have the essentials to start. Development depends on you seizing opportunities and engaging in ministries of blessings for the church of God, for people's lives in general, and for the preaching of the gospel. The Holy Spirit does not make mistakes. He has given or will give you gifts that match your personality

The Sweet Call to Discipleship

Discipleship

"A disciple is a person who submits to a master to learn and grow, aiming to become like the master, walking and living in submission to him."

The disciple of Christ knows that they need to prepare for fulfilling the mission He left us, while seeking a personal experience with the master Jesus, to the point of being able to say like Paul: "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). Being a disciple also involves preparing other people to be disciples.

Seven essential actions in discipleship

- **1. Visitation:** We visit our disciple's home and bring them to ours, bringing families closer.
- 2. **Readings:** We share selected literature encouraging them to read regularly.
- **3. Dedicate time:** We nurture the connection between us. We keep in touch and stay connected frequently.
- 4. Coexistence: Our disciple needs to learn with us through our words at all times, but especially by living together.

- **5. Experience**: We provide opportunities for our disciples to develop in ministries, helping them identify their area of talent or gift.
- **6. Prayer:** We include our disciple in our prayer agenda and let them know about it.
- Mentoring: We accompany this person, helping or guiding them whenever possible.

We need to deny ourselves and everything that keeps us from living like Jesus. The text from Luke leads us to understand that when there are disagreements between the opinions of others and the will of God, we should choose God's will, but without fighting and ceasing to love these people. "Cross" means suffering and rejection. Mark 8:31-38 says that if we are disciples of Jesus, we will not be discouraged by these situations. The disciple doesn't choose to suffer, but they don't deviate from their purpose in the face of the possibility of suffering. Many want to be Christians without a cross, without renunciation, denial of themselves, and breaking away from the world. This is impossible!
